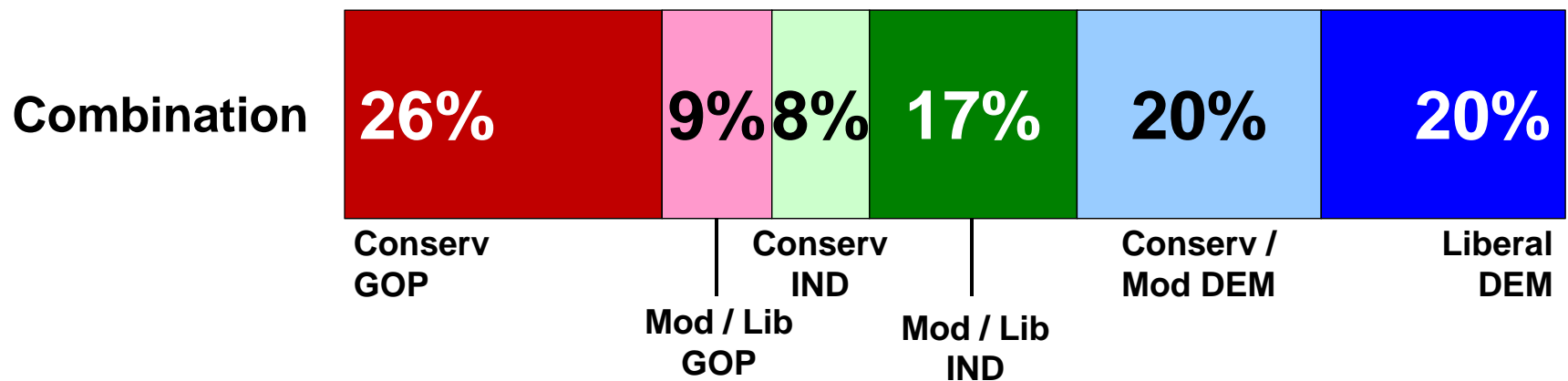

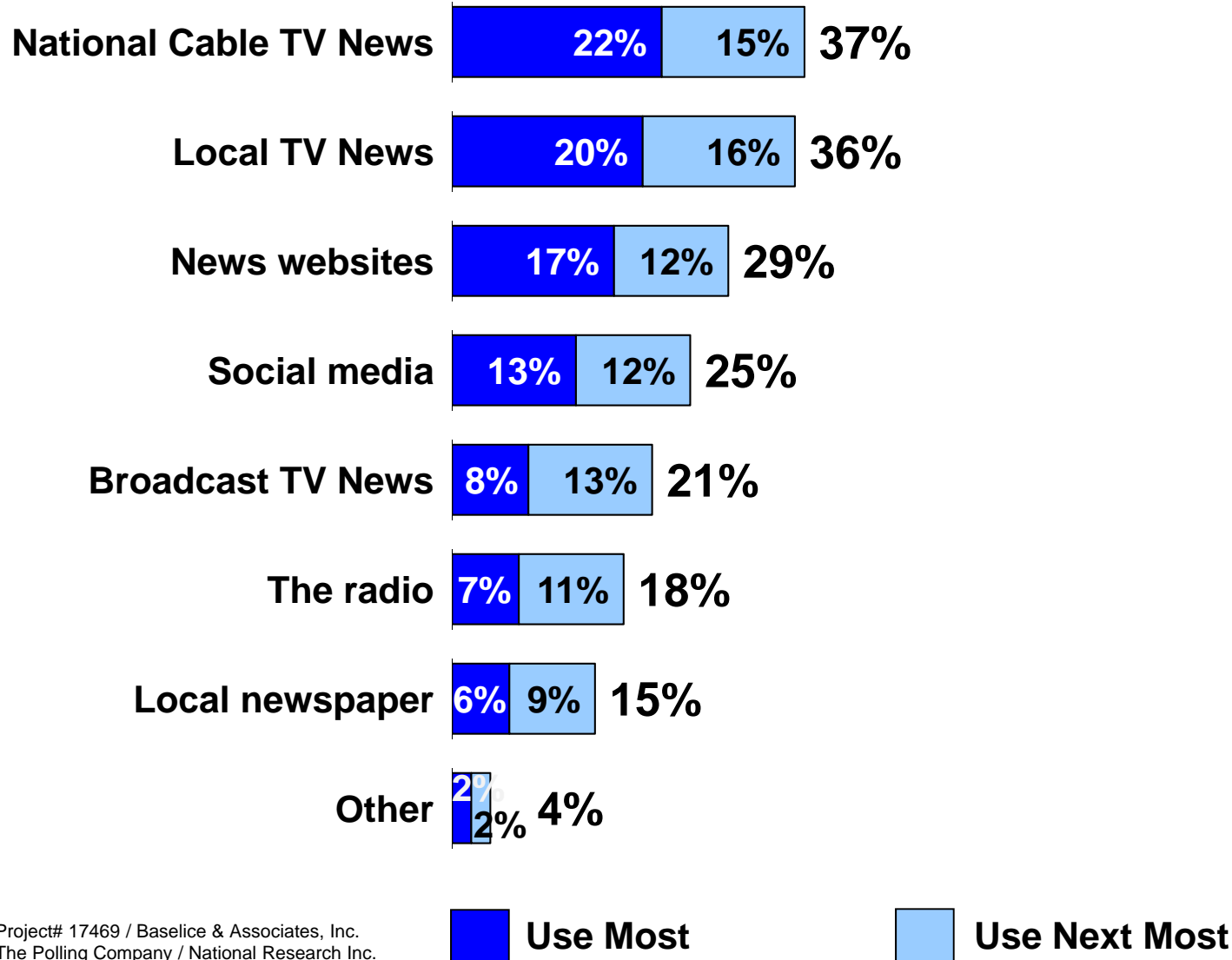

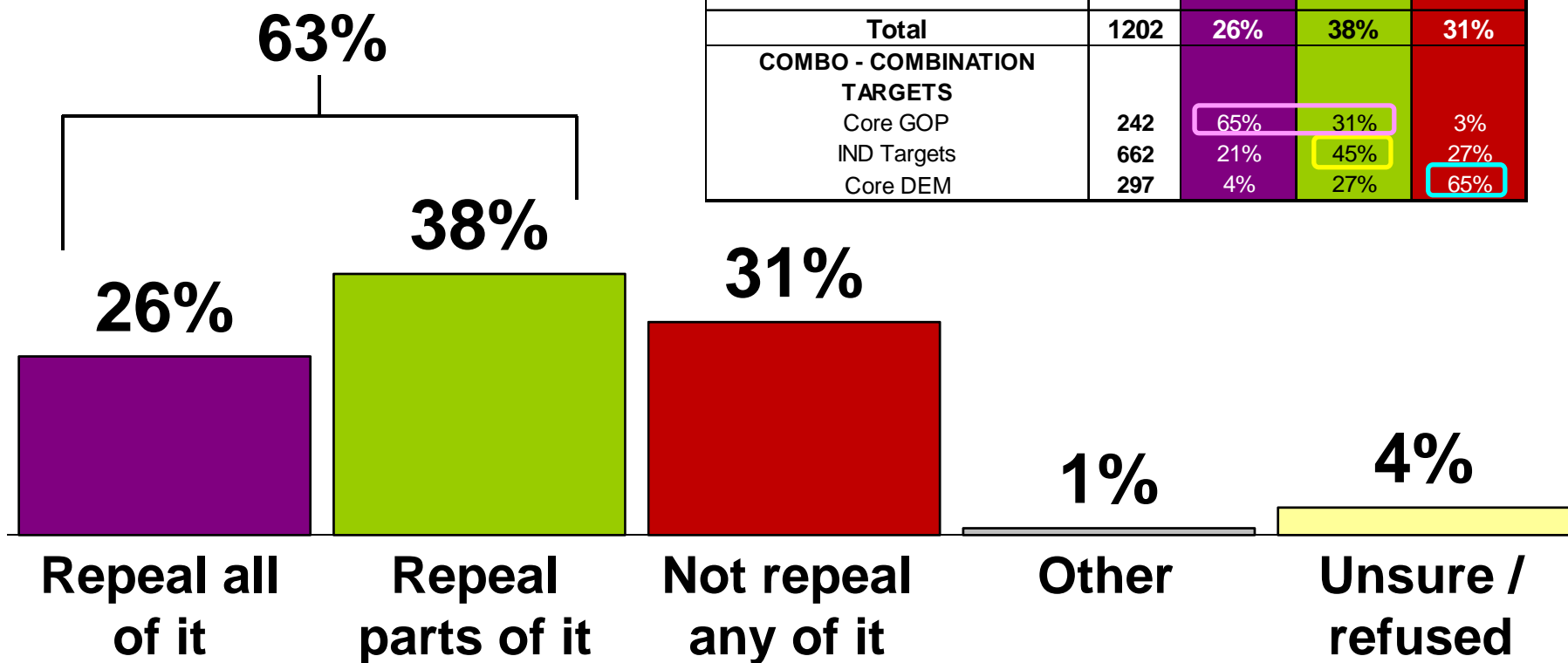

Which of the following do you MOST regularly use as a source for news and information on current events?



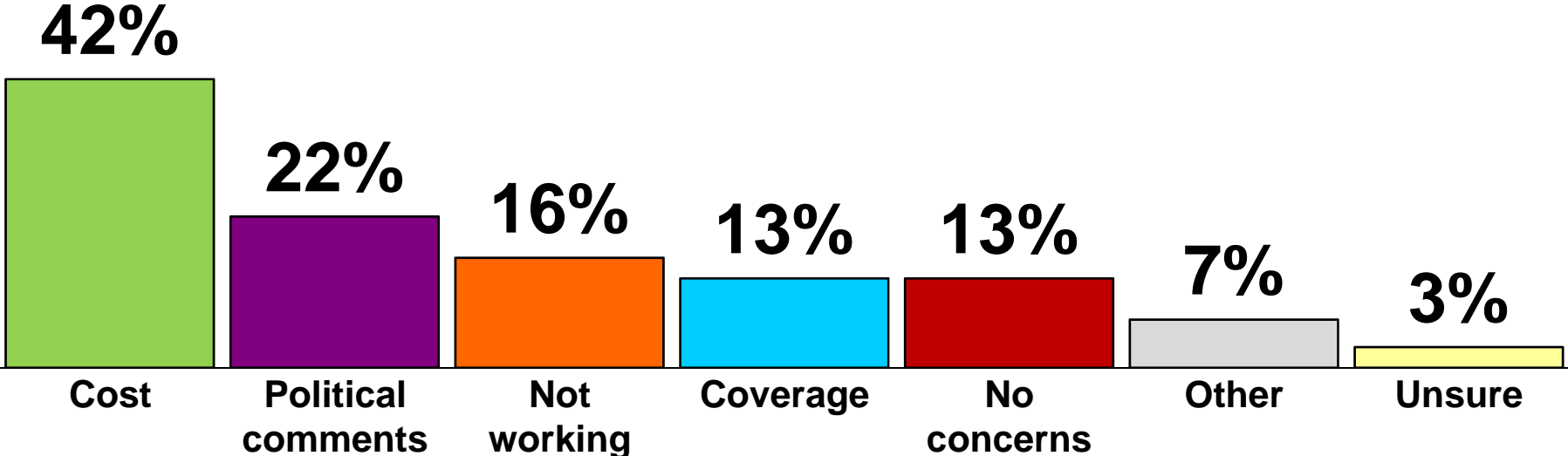
# REPEAL AFFORDABLE CARE ACT

# IMPACT OF CANDIDATE’S POSITIONS

A candidate who supports higher taxes on prescription drugs and other health insurance covered medical devices.	12%	76%	12%
A candidate who supports a failing healthcare system that already put tens of thousands of people at risk of losing insurance after one state's insurance market collapsed.	15%	68%	17%
A candidate who prefers to maintain ObamaCare with its higher insurance premiums, higher deductibles, and fewer health insurance choices.	22%	66%	12%
A candidate who opposes providing additional funding specifically targeted for maternity coverage and newborn care, as well as mental health and substance abuse disorders.	26%	63%	11%
A candidate who opposes preserving job-based health insurance, and who opposes improving fairness and flexibility for those purchasing insurance in the employer marketplace.	24%	62%	14%
A candidate who prefers to keep ObamaCare which has led to small businesses having to cancel their health insurance benefits completely or dumping an unknown number of employees into ineffective exchanges.	23%	61%	16%
A candidate who opposes giving states more flexibility for their individual Medicaid programs (Ver Y: such as block grants and optional work requirements).	29%	60%	11%
